TO: PASTORS, CHURCH BOARD, AND CHURCH MEMBERS.

Re: THE FOOD BANK, "GIVING, CARING, SHARING."

Did you know that somebody is dying from starvation at this moment and before the next (5) minutes, over fifty (50) persons will die from hunger worldwide? At this very moment, over 400,000 persons in Jamaica are hungry. That is an average of approximately of 27,000 people in each parish across Jamaica. They are in every community and quite likely in your congregation, on your street and probably beside you.

This inspires us to seek and source food for distribution to all those who are in need in Jamaica. In order to make this venture a reality, each member is being asked to contribute at least One Thousand (\$1,000) towards the Food Bank annually.
